



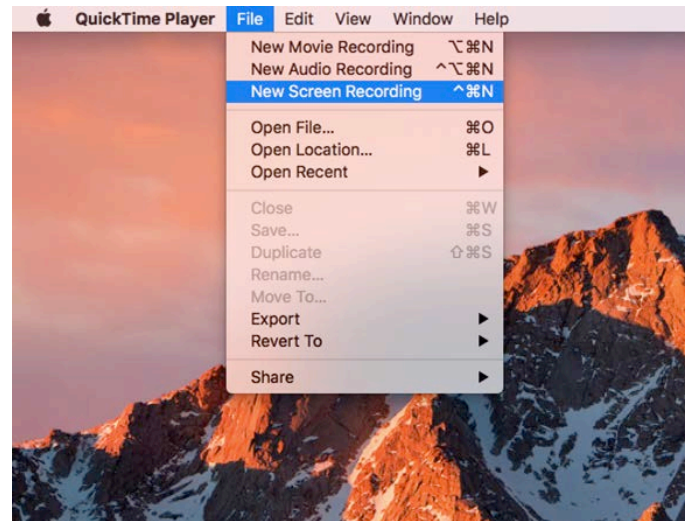
Apple Showcase Title: Presentation Using Quicktime Recording

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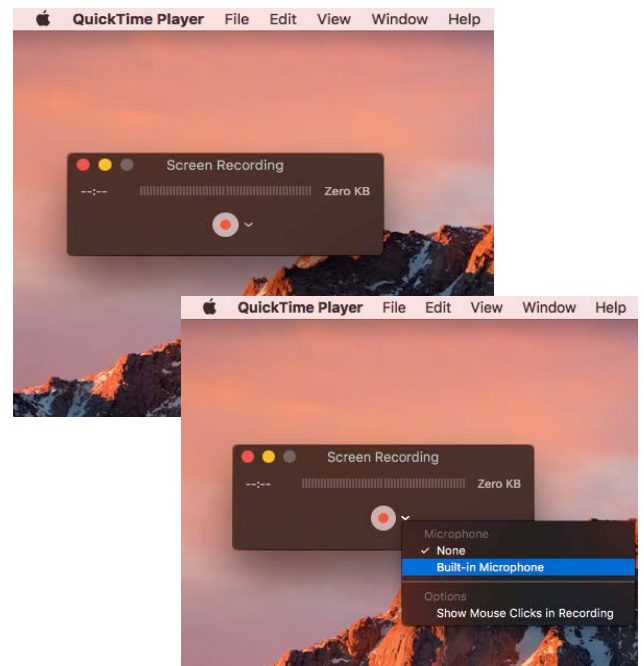
Project Tools Used: Quicktime, MacBook

TOOL TUTORIAL

Open up Quicktime Player (Spotlight search or go to applications) Click File and click New Screen Recording



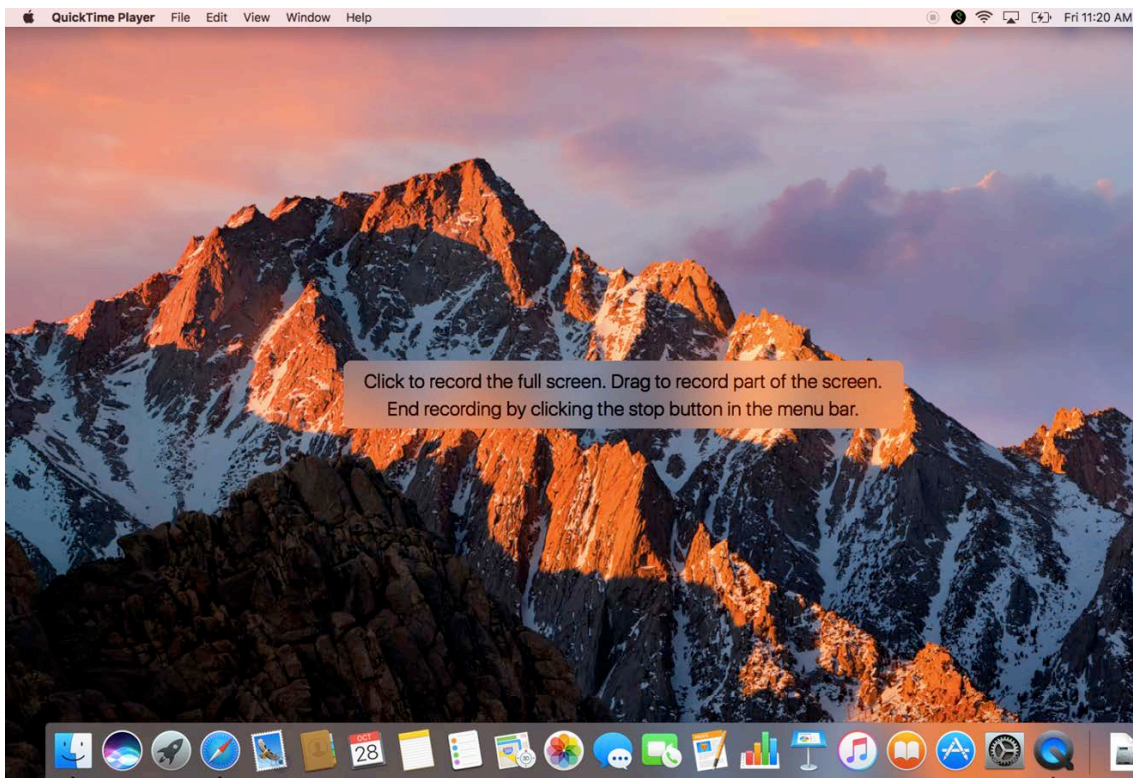
The Quicktime Screen recording window will open up. Here you have a couple of options. You can just click record to use the built in Mic or you can click the downward arrow to select a audio input (an external USB mic).





Once you have selected what you want to use click the "Record Button"

The window that comes up explains how to select your recording area.



You will notice the Stop recording at the top right of the screen.

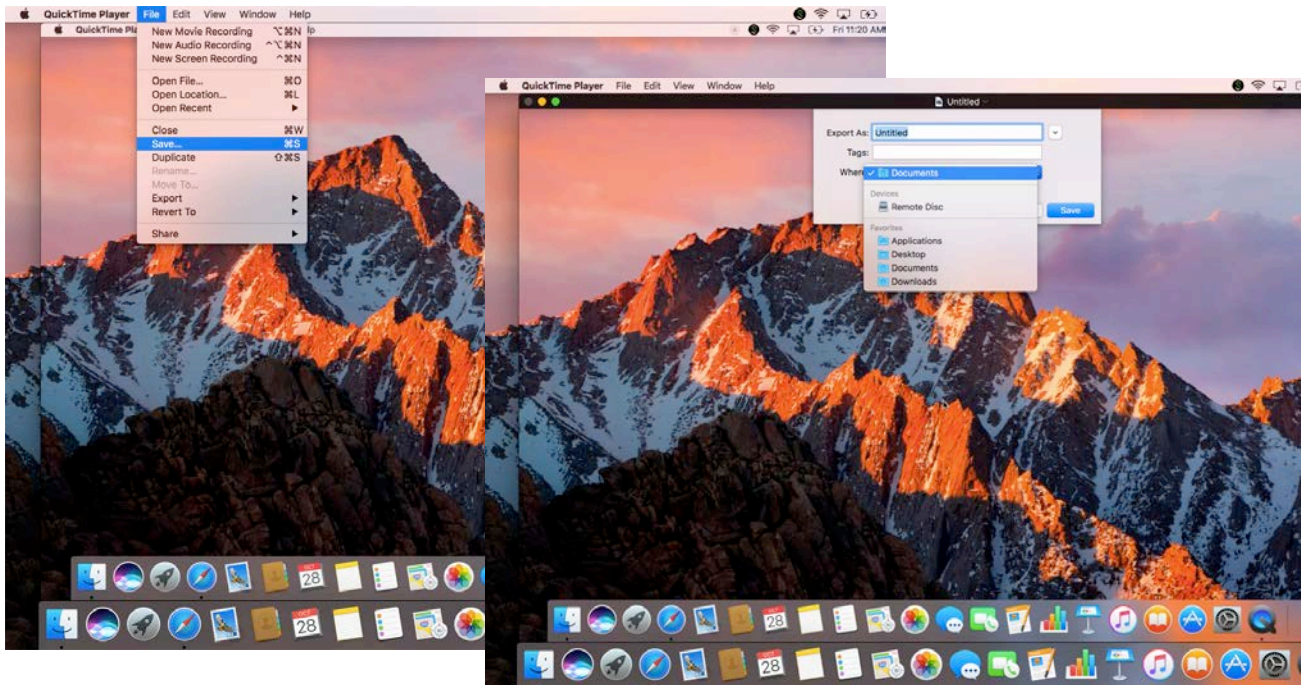




Once you hit the Stop Recording the Screen recording will open immediately in Quicktime Player. You can go ahead and play it if you like.



You'll then click on File in the menu bar at the top, click Save, and save your movie file. Select where you want to save the movie, name it, and then click save.



From here you'll import the video into your editing software of choice and make cuts wherever you need to. If your recording was flawless, there may be no need to do any edits.
